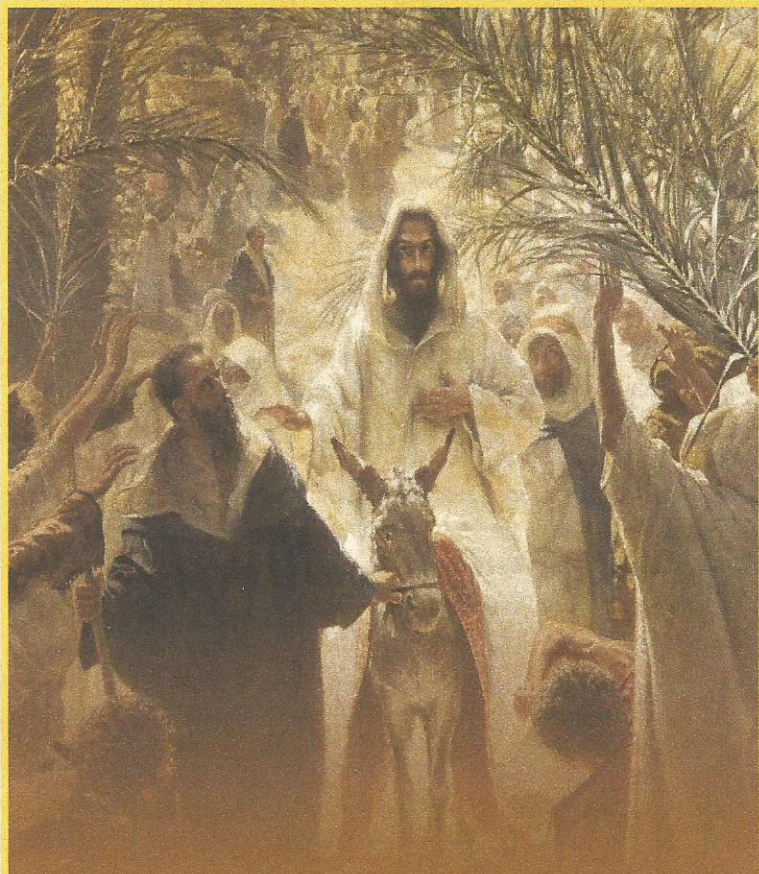

Dear Parishioners,

On this **Palm Sunday**, the change in liturgical colors visually reminds us that our preparation is about to reach its high point in the celebration of the Paschal Triduum. The violet of penance gives way to the red of blood, passion, martyrdom, and the Holy Spirit.

This year we begin this holiest of all weeks by hearing Mark's passion account of how Jesus is betrayed, denied, and abandoned. Their "**Hosannas**" quickly turn into "**let him be crucified.**" In the drama of Passion narrative, Jesus stands front and center, alone. He has preached, healed, and taught among those who now plot against him, mock him, and hand him over to the powers that be. His silence speaks volumes. The women who followed him from Galilee can now look on from a distance—but they remain. Their love outweighs their fear.

Can we **walk with Jesus this Holy Week** and spend some time meditating on his pain and agony? Let the Passion narrative sink in and influence our lives. Let us recognize the Passion as an event of hope and revelation of God's redeeming love for us. Hopefully, you can participate in the celebrations of Holy Week.

As we welcome our friends and neighbors to the **Spaghetti Dinner**, we thank Gary Alvarado, Elaine Ekes, Susan Gehrig and all their helpers for putting on this great banquet for us.

The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character of Lent. For this reason, Catholics, who have celebrated their 14th birthday, are bound to **abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent**; the age of fasting is from the completion of the 18th year to the beginning of the 60th year. Hence, in addition to abstaining from meat, one should **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**, eating only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those two days.

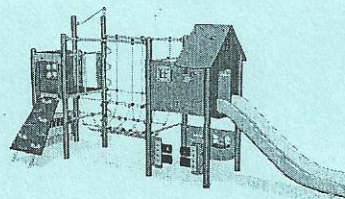
