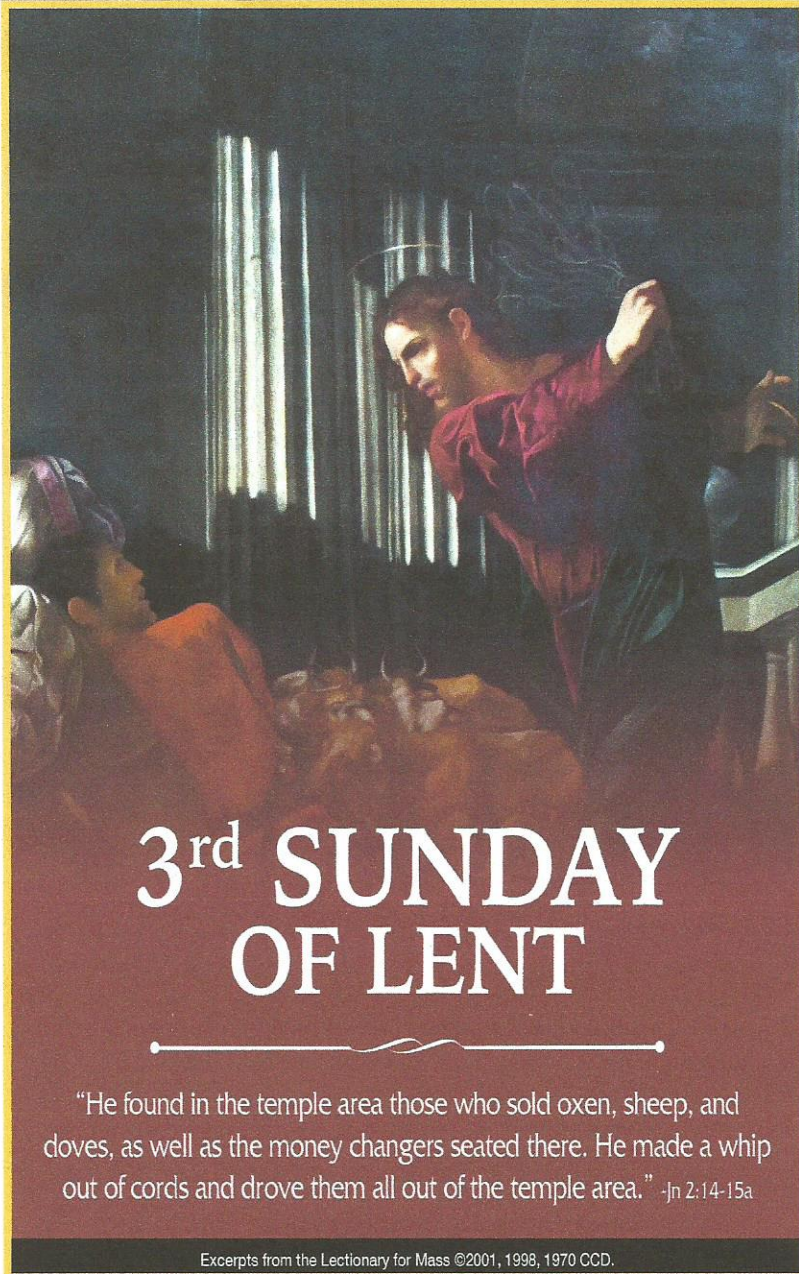

Dear Parishioners,

On this Third Sunday of Lent, St. John gives us the dramatic account of Jesus' cleansing the Temple of its merchants and money-changers, followed by a prediction of his death and Resurrection. Jesus cleansed the Temple which King Herod began to renovate in 20 B.C.

The abuses which kindled the prophetic indignation of Jesus were the conversion of God's Temple into a "noisy market place" by the animal merchants and into a "hideout of thieves" by the money-changers with their grossly unjust business practices - sacrilege in God's Holy Place. Jesus' reaction to this commercialized Faith was fierce. Since no weapons were allowed inside the Temple, Jesus had to construct his own weapon, a whip of cords, to drive out the merchants and money-changers from the Court of the Gentiles.

St. Paul reminds us that we are God's temples because the Spirit of God dwells in us. Hence, we have no right to desecrate God's temple by impurity, injustice, pride, hatred or jealousy. Let us be cleansed by asking God's forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Let us remember that we are the temples of the Holy Spirit.

The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character of Lent. For this reason, Catholics, who have celebrated their 14th birthday, are bound to **abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent**; the age of fasting is from the completion of the 18th year to the beginning of the 60th year. Hence, in addition to abstaining from meat, one should **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**, eating only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those two days.

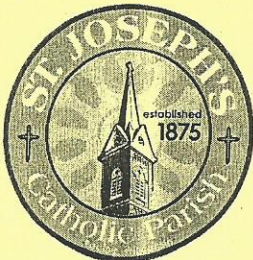

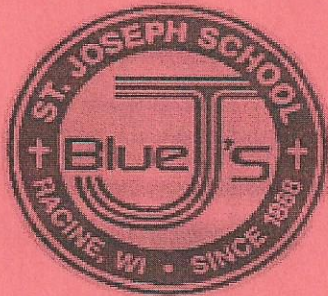
