



Dear Parishioners,

Week after week, you see them at St. Joseph's Churchflanking the larger statue of St. Joseph and peering out from their niches in our beautiful, ornate, wooden back altar. Who are they and why were they selected?

They are from left to right: St. Charles Borromeo, holding the crucifix, archbishop and founder of seminaries for the education of priests; St. Catherine of Alexandria with her spiked wheel of torture before martyrdom; St. Theresa of Ávila, founder of the Discalced Carmelites, with quill and book in hand for writings that earned her the title, Doctor of the Church; and St. Bernard of Clairvaux, Cistercian abbot and Doctor of the Church, holding a staff and monastery model symbolizing the many monasteries he founded.

Thanks to the Salbreiter family history compiled by Jo Ann Salbreiter Noll and generously shared by parishioner Sue Salbreiter Christensen, the backstory comes to light. German immigrants Bernard (Bernhardt) Salbreiter (April 15, 1808-May 26, 1901) and Theresa Kaufelt Salbreiter (May 1, 1812-February 11, 1897) were charter members of St. Joseph Catholic Church at its founding in 1875. "Before that they traveled to St. Mary's Church all the way downtown.... When Bernard died [at 93 years old], he had the distinction of being Racine's oldest German.... Bernard's obituary stated, 'He was identified with the city in its infancy and saw it grow from a hamlet to a thriving town, second in size in the state."

Upon the settling of Bernard's estate, daughter Dora "took some of the money to buy statues for the main altar at St. Joseph's in honor of Bernard and Theresa, her mother and father, and Charles and Catherine, her brother and his wife." Dora, along with the help of her parents Bernard and Theresa, raised Charles B. [1850-August 3, 1890] and Catherine's [1846-January 8, 1887] four children orphaned at an early age.

One of those children grew up to become Father Bernard Salbreiter, "the first priest ordained from St. Joseph's parish.... He was ordained June 17, 1901 at 23 years old." His Aunt Dora "remained single and went to Sheboygan to be housekeeper for 'Father Barney'" who died April 13, 1940. "Archbishop Moses Kiley and more than 100 priests attended his funeral at St. Joseph's."

Sue Salbreiter Christensen is the great-granddaughter of Charles B. and Catherine Coyne Salbreiter and the greatgreat-granddaughter of Bernard (Bernhardt) and Theresa Kaufelt Salbreiter.
