

Dear Parishioners.

We are concluding the Easter Season with the celebration of Pentecost Sunday. **Pentecost literally means 50**<sup>th</sup>. It is a feast celebrated on the 50<sup>th</sup> day after the Passover feast by the Jews and a feast celebrated on the 50<sup>th</sup> day after the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus by the Christians.

On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary as fiery tongues. The frightened apostles were transformed into fiery preachers and evangelizers and were given the gift of tongues by a special anointing of the Holy Spirit. The listeners experienced the Power and Presence of the Holy Spirit through the apostles' gift of tongues as they heard Peter speaking in their native languages.

The Holy Spirit, the Helper, is quietly at work in the generosity of those who give us so much help; in the inner strength we discover in times of crisis; in those moments when we admit that we have been wrong; in the resilience of people who face one bad thing after another; in times when we have dared to love even though it was hard to do so. August 6 - August 10


