

Dear Parishioners,

The mystery of the most **Holy Trinity** is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature, coequal and co-eternal.

Our mind cannot grasp this doctrine which teaches that 1+1+1=1 and not 3. **But we believe in this Mystery** because Jesus who is God taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith.

Today's feast invites us to **live in the awareness of the presence** of the Triune God within us: The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Our conviction that the Triune God is present within us should always help us to esteem ourselves as God's holy dwelling place, to behave well in His holy presence, and to lead purer and holier lives, practicing acts of justice and charity. This Triune Presence should also encourage us to respect and honor others as "Temples of the Holy Spirit."
