A scribe, who believed in both the written Law and the oral tradition, was pleased to see how Jesus defeated the Sadducees who had tried to humiliate Him with the hypothetical case of a woman who had married seven husbands.

He asks Jesus to summarize the most important of the Mosaic Laws in one sentence. Jesus cites the first sentences of the Jewish Shema prayer: "Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength" (Deuteronomy 6:4). Then He adds its complementary law: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Leviticus 19:18).

Thus, Jesus says that true religion is loving God and loving our fellow human beings at the same time. That means the only way a person can demonstrate real love of God is by showing genuine, active love for his neighbor. We have to help, support, encourage, forgive, and pray for everyone, without discrimination based on color, race, gender, age wealth or social status.
