

Today's Gospel explains how Jesus has accomplished his mission of saving mankind from the slavery of sin by becoming the "Suffering Servant." Here, Jesus challenges his followers to become great by serving others with sacrificial agape love: "Whoever wishes to be great must be a servant." Jesus commands us to liberate others as he has freed all of us, by giving ourselves to them in loving and humble service.

On this **World Mission Sunday**, Catholics gather to celebrate the Eucharist and to support the work of evangelization around the world. This annual celebration gives us a chance to reflect on the importance of mission work for the life of the Church. It reminds us that we are one with the Church around the world and that we are all committed to carrying on the mission of Christ, however different our situations may be.

God the Father sent God the Son into the world with a message of God's love and salvation. Thus, the evangelizing mission of the Church is essentially the announcement of God's love, mercy, forgiveness, and salvation, as these are revealed to mankind through the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord.


