



Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, we begin a series of seven Sunday Gospel readings from Mark's account of the journey of Jesus and his disciples from northern Galilee to Jerusalem. Along the way, Jesus gave instructions about his identity and what it meant to follow him (discipleship). Today's Gospel, relating the first of Jesus' three prophecies of his passion, death and Resurrection, consists of two sections: the Messianic confession of Peter and Jesus' prediction of his Passion, death and Resurrection, followed by his clear teaching on discipleship.

For the first time in their relationship, Peter, speaking for the other disciples, declared publicly: "You are the Christ (Messiah) the Son of the living God." Peter was the first apostle to recognize Jesus publicly as the Anointed One (also translated Messiah or Christ).

Let us ask ourselves the question of what Jesus means to us. How do I really see Jesus? Is Jesus a living experience for me, walking with me, loving me, forgiving me, helping me and transforming my life and outlook? What difference does Jesus make in my life? Are there areas where I have excluded Him, where my life is not noticeably different from the lives of those who see Jesus as irrelevant? The knowledge of Jesus as Lord and personal Savior needs to become a living, personal experience for each Christian.

The Deacon Cross

This cross with the diagonal stole is the symbol of a deacon. Deacons in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee may wear a Roman collar when doing their ministry but will always wear this cross to indicate that they are a deacon and not a priest. When serving at the altar, deacons wear a colored diagonal stole across their white alb.

Holy Orders and Purpose of the Diaconate

A deacon receives the sacrament of Holy Orders like priests and bishops, however, he is ordained to the order of the diaconate which has its own specific purpose of service. A deacon is called to become "Christ the Servant" in his ministry and assist the bishops and priests in their work. A man can be ordained a deacon even if he is already married. Being a deacon is an unpaid part-time ministry during which the man retains his regular job to support his family. Deacons are assigned to a parish and can often remain there for many years.

Potential Roles for Deacons in Ministry

Service to the Word

Deacons can lead RCIA, Bible studies, baptism, and marriage preparation.

Service of the Altar

Deacons can assist at Mass, proclaim the Gospel, preach, and care for Eucharist. Deacons can conduct baptisms, weddings, and funerals outside of Mass.

Service of Charity

Deacons can minister in hospitals, nursing homes and jails. Deacons can also create new ministries to help the poor.

Specific Roles for Deacon Doug in His First Year at St. Joseph:

- 1. Lead RCIA to encourage then prepare people to join the Catholic Church.
- 2. Work with engaged couples to prepare for marriage using FOCCUS program.
- 3. Assist at Mass one weekend per month at both St. Joseph Masses.
- 4. Assist & preach at Mass on one weekend per month at both St. Joseph Masses.
- 5. Conduct baptisms outside Mass and funerals/committals outside Mass if needed.
- 6. Conduct prayer and communion service at Villa Nursing Home.
- 7. Take eucharist to All Saints Hospital monthly and to homebound as needed.
