

### DEAR PARISHIONERS

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as "Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday," expressing the Church's joy in anticipation of the Resurrection of our Lord. The healing of blind man described in today's Gospel occurred when Jesus came to Jerusalem with his Apostles to participate in the feast of Tabernacles or Sukkoth. As part of the Sukkoth celebration, four huge golden four-branched candelabra were lit in the Temple courts—each was 50 cubits (75 feet) high. The Mishnah says that "there was not a courtyard in all of Jerusalem" that did not gleam with the light from the Temple menorahs when they were lit for Sukkoth. The Gospel's healing of the blind man shows the mercy and kindness of Jesus, "the light of the world."

Presenting the miracle of Jesus' giving of sight to a man born blind, today's Gospel teaches us the necessity of being willing to have our eyes opened by faith. Here the most unlikely person, the beggar born blind, receives the light of faith in Jesus, while the religion-oriented, laweducated Pharisees remain spiritually blind. To live as a Christian is to see and to grow continually, gaining clearer vision of God, ourselves and others.

Take a deeper look at our Lenten prayers and sacrifices, which aim to heal our spiritual blindness, so we can see others as children of God and our own brothers and sisters. Ask God to remove the root causes of our blindness—self-centeredness, greed, anger, hatred, prejudice, jealousy, evil habits, and stubbornness. Let us pray with the Scottish Bible scholar William Barclay, "God our Father, help us see Christ more clearly, love him more dearly and follow him more nearly" day by day.

\*\*The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason, Catholics, who have celebrated their 14th birthday, are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent; Catholics, who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days, they may eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.
