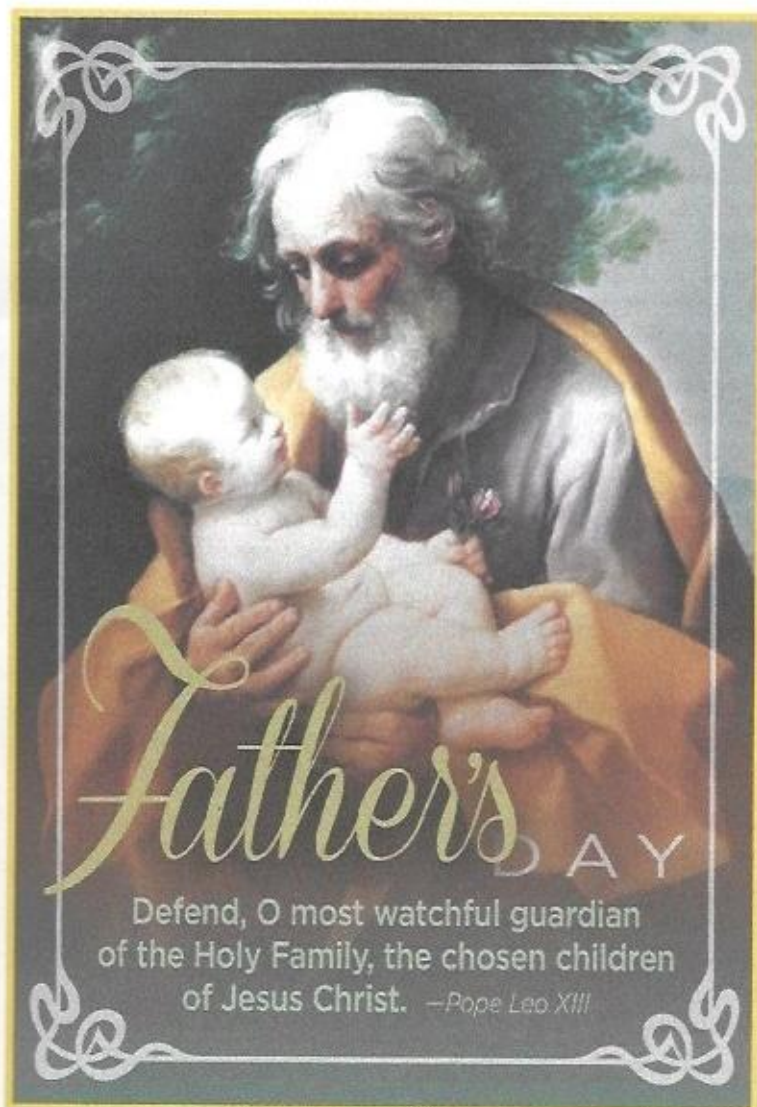

Dear Parishioners,

The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature. The oldest doctrinal formulation of the Church's belief in the Trinity is found in the Apostles' Creed which has served both as the basis of instruction for catechumens and as the Baptismal confession of Faith since the second century. Later, the Nicene Creed, originating at the Council of Nicaea (AD 325), stated the doctrine more explicitly.

God has revealed to us three separate functions that are carried out by the Three Persons. He has told us that it is proper to attribute to God the Father the work of Creation, to God the Son the work of Redemption, and to God the Holy Spirit the work of Sanctification. Our knowledge of God as Trinity is made possible *by God*, who has chosen to reveal Himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

We are created in love to be a community of loving persons, just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are united in love. From the day of our Baptism, we have belonged to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. How privileged we are to grow up in such a beautiful Family! Hence, let us turn to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in prayer every day. We belong to the Family of the Triune God.

On this Father's Day weekend, let us pray for all our Dads, and thank God for their life of witness and commitment.

Our actions can either bear witness to that reality or it can bring offense.

Let us pray that enough of us will choose the holy way so all the world may see that God is real, Jesus is alive, and we are ONE.
