

Dear Parishioners,

In Matthew and Mark, Jesus asked certain questions about his identity. This incident took place at Caesarea Philippi (presently called Banias), twenty-five miles northeast of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus asked a question in two parts. The first question is, "Who do people say that the Son Man is?" and the second question is, "But who do you that I am?"

For the first time, as the spokesman for the apostles, Peter confesses Jesus as his Lord and Savior and Jesus, in turn, approves Peter's words and gives him teaching and ruling authority in his Church. Thus, Jesus establishes a "Magisterium" in his Church to serve the spiritual and physical needs of the Church members. By Jesus' statement, "I will give you the Keys to the Kingdom of Heaven," he gives Peter and his successors the power to bind and to loose (make laws; exercise authority) in the Church, and the assurance that their decisions will be ratified in Heaven.

Let us, too, confess Jesus as the Son of God and our personal Savior. This means that we are accepting

Jesus as our Good Shepherd, our Divine Savior and our Redeemer. Next, Jesus should become a living experience for us as our God protecting us and providing for us in our life's journey. This is made possible by our listening to Jesus through the daily, meditative reading of the Bible; by talking to Jesus

through daily, personal, communal and liturgical prayers; by offering our lives on the altar with Jesus whenever we participate in the Holy Mass; and by receiving him in Holy Communion.

On August 27, we welcome back the St. Joseph School teachers and learn-from-school students beginning the new school year. God bless you.
