

DEAR PARISHIONERS

This week we continue to be with Jesus in Jerusalem, it was the third day of what we have come to call "Holy Week." It was a day of controversy and personal attacks. Jesus was under fire and challenged the religious leaders of Israel for rejecting him as Messiah.

As a prophetic peacemaker, Jesus challenges those who pervert religion into an opportunity to gain personal honor, glory, and power. Jesus accuses the scribes and Pharisees of seeking for themselves the glory that rightly belongs to God. The real goal of the Pharisees was to dress and act in such a way as to draw attention to themselves, instead of glorifying God. In their misguided zeal for religion, they sought respect and honor for themselves rather than for God. They expressed their love of honor in several ways, thereby converting Judaism into a religion of ostentation.

Today, Jesus calls for integrity and honesty from all those in authority, whether priests, parents, teachers or politicians. Leaders should have no double standards. Rather, there should grow a deep sense of equality with, and mutual respect between, leaders and those they rule. Fach should seek to serve the other.

Service, not status, is the mark of this new community, and true humility is the only position its members should seek. Let us render humble, selfless, diligent, committed, loving service to others in the community without expecting honor or rewards in return.




