

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE FUTURE OF OUR PARISH

As promised, I will be giving weekly updates on any questions you may have about our future. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to let me know. Today, I am sharing two questions asked.

Why do we need a new parish name? Our collaboration process and discernment led us to merge our eight parishes into a new canonical and civil entity, which is why we need a new name. The new name allows us to be one parish while preserving the unique cultural identities of each of the eight churches. We will no longer be called the Catholic Community of Eight in Racine, but Saint Leo the Great Parish.

Will the name of our church building or location change? The parish will be called Saint Leo the Great, but each of the current eight churches will keep its individual name. For example, it could be Saint Leo the Great's Meal Program is held at Saint Patrick's Church. This way, people understand it is our meal program, but the location serving the meal is Saint Patrick's Church.

EASTER 2026

Do not be afraid. Go tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me.

- Matthew 28:10



Hello Everyone,

In Jesus' first words to the women at the tomb, he says three things we can take to heart.

First, he says, "Do not be afraid." We all have something we're afraid of. Jesus' ultimate triumph over sin and death should cast away all our fears and worries. Of course, this is much harder in practice than in theory, but we are reminded to cling to God's promises and not be afraid.

Then he tells them to "go" and tell. The women at the tomb become the first evangelists, and this is the call to us as well. Go! Go tell your children and spouses. Go tell the neighbors who live next to you. Jesus has conquered death and defeated our sin. We are meant to be on the move. Go. Tell.

Lastly, he tells them that they will see him in Galilee. What is Galilee for us? It is our mission field. When you think about your own mission field, you might wonder if you're being called to some distant land, like the prophets of old. For many of us, our Galilee is much closer than we think. Your "Galilee," the place where you will see Jesus — is the home in which you live, the place in which you work, the community in which you are rooted, the Church in which you worship. The people in those places are those in whom you will see Jesus.

Everything has changed. Do not be afraid. Go and tell others that Jesus is alive. Then you will see Jesus in yourself and in others.

If you or someone you know are unable to attend Mass and would like a Communion visit and/or the sacraments, please call any of our parish offices. If someone is bringing you the Eucharist, they need to have an appropriate pyx and pouch.

For all who take communion to someone outside of church, we are adopting a new policy starting April 12: Wearing a certified "CCER/Family of Eight" pouch entitles you to receive the Eucharist in your pyx in the communion line during Mass. If you are not wearing it, you may be asked to wait and get communion for your pyx from the deacon or priest after Mass. These cloth pouches with embroidered crosses indicate you have completed the training for Visiting Eucharistic Ministers (VEM). If you have not been trained, please contact any deacon for a short training after Mass.


