## GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

Today, our liturgical journey brings us to a pivotal moment in the life of Christ: **The Baptism of the Lord**. This event serves as the official inauguration of Jesus' public ministry in his Galilean life. When he stands in the waters of the Jordan, we see a profound intersection of humility and divinity. John the Baptist recognizes him and baptizes him to fulfill the promises of God in his prophecies, signaling that the long-awaited hope of Israel has arrived.

As Jesus emerges from the water, the heavens open, and the voice of the Father affirms the Son's mission. This divine "stamp of approval" sets the stage for everything we will witness in the coming liturgical year. To understand the true focus of Jesus' ministry, we look back to the prophet Isaiah, who provided the "blueprint" for the Messiah hundreds of years before his birth. Isaiah describes a servant-king who does not lead with a heavy hand: *"He shall bring forth justice to the nations, not crying out, not shouting, not making his voice heard in the street; a bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench, until he establishes justice on the earth; the coastlands will wait for his teaching."*


These words stand in stark contrast to the worldly powers of both the past and the present. They speak of a message rooted in the **gentleness and kindness** of God's Kingdom. Jesus does not come to crush the weak or extinguish the flickering hope of the weary; instead, he comes to fan the flame of faith back to life. Throughout the Gospels, we will see this prophecy in action. There will be many times that broken people—those cast aside by society, the ill, and the spiritually burdened—will come to him. In every encounter, Jesus restores them to their wholeness through God's mercy. His teaching, while firm and rooted in truth, remains consistently gentle. It is this unique balance of strength and compassion that moves hearts to believe in a future of justice and peace.

As we journey through this year, we are invited to model our own lives after this "Gentle King." Where is there a "bruised reed" in your life—a relationship or a person who needs a gentle touch rather than a harsh word? How can we, as a community, tend the "smoldering wick" of hope for those who feel forgotten? By following Jesus' example, we don't just observe his mission; we participate in it. Are you ready to set out on an intentional journey to follow the Lord?

One intentional thing you can do this year is to **learn** more about the Lord. Mark your calendars for January 24 from 9 to 11:30 a.m. for our Scripture Conference on the Gospel of Matthew with Dr. Dan Scholz. The talk will focus on the Gospel of Matthew, especially the Prophetic call to discipleship. The conference will be held in Haban Hall, Sacred Heart. I hope to see you there.


