PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

MARCH 29, 2026 | 05

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

Today, the Church stands at the doorstep of Holy Week, holding two very different moments together in a single liturgy. With palms raised high, we rejoice as Jesus enters Jerusalem to shouts of **"Hosanna to the Son of David!"** The triumphant moment quickly turns into silence, and then into rejection, as we listen to the Passion of the Lord according to Matthew. This sacred tension is also part of our lives, as we experience moments of joy and triumph, but also face hard times and the pain of our own crosses.

Palm Sunday invites us into the emotional depth of the final week of Jesus' earthly life. It was a week marked by freely given love, misunderstanding, betrayal, loneliness, suffering, and unwavering trust in the Father. Jesus knew what awaited him, and still he chose to enter Jerusalem. He did not turn away from the cross. He walked toward it, fully present, fully obedient, fully loving. Jesus's resolve to fulfill his mission as the Son of God is a powerful call for each of us to answer our own personal calls to be fully present and obedient to God's plan.

Holy Week is not meant to be hurried or treated as background noise to our daily routines. It is sacred time. Each day reveals a profound moment: the intimacy of friendship and service on Holy Thursday, the anguish of abandonment on Good Friday, the silence of the tomb on Holy Saturday, and, ultimately, the victory of life over death on Easter Sunday. The mystery of our salvation is summed up in those sacred moments. Make sure to navigate this week and meditate on each of these moments.


The Church invites us this week to slow down, to be intentional and mindful, and to allow these days to shape our hearts. Where do I see myself in the Passion narrative? Am I quick to praise but slow to remain faithful? Do I keep watch with Christ, or do I fall asleep when discipleship becomes difficult?

As we enter Holy Week, we are called not simply to remember what Jesus did long ago, but to walk with him now, to accompany him with prayer, reverence, and attention. Make time for the liturgies. Create a quiet space. Let the words, gestures, and silences speak.

May this week draw us deeper into the mystery of God's love, soften our hearts, and prepare us to truly rejoice when Easter dawns. This week let us fix our eyes on Jesus as we explore his final days in the week's liturgies. I hope to see you on Monday, March 30, at 6 P.M. at Saint Edward for our Food for the Journey event as we meditate on the Journey to the Cross.

For all who take communion to someone outside of church, we are adopting a new policy starting April 12: Wearing a certified "CCER/Family of Eight" pouch entitles you to receive the Eucharist in your pyx in the communion line during Mass. If you are not wearing it, you may be asked to wait and get communion for your pyx from the deacon or priest after Mass. These cloth pouches with embroidered crosses indicate you have completed the training for Visiting Eucharistic Ministers (VEM). If you have not been trained, please contact any deacon for a short training after Mass.



Update on the Planning and Merger Process

Grace and Peace to you, my brothers and sisters,

As we enter April, I will provide weekly updates on the merger process. I will dedicate a section in the bulletin to share news with you. This will be my longest message. I will try to address any questions you may have about the future of our parish in about 200 words to keep you informed. Today, I am sharing two major decisions that have been made with the support of the planning team and the trustees.

First, Trustees: The new trustees for Saint Leo the Great Parish are Kathy Garski and Camela Meyer. Both are currently trustees at Saint Richard and Sacred Heart. We chose them after a discernment process involving the 16 trustees from 8 parishes. I am grateful for their willingness to serve our new parish. I am also grateful for the hard work of the rest of the trustees who will take us to the finish line by June 30, 2026, as important leaders of our parishes.

Second, Finance Council: After considering the advice and input from the planning team, I have decided to ask our current Finance and Facilities Team to serve as the new Finance Council for Saint Leo the Great. The team includes one member from each parish and consists of highly capable individuals. Members are Suzane Yde from SJN, Pete Koleske from SJ, Jeff Hollow from SH, Mick Moore from SP, Ed Morelli from SR, Ben Baran from SE, Joe Pitts from SL, and John Suchla from SS. I am also grateful for those members of the finance councils of the eight parishes who have served so faithfully for many years.

In upcoming meetings of the pastoral council, we will discern our new Pastoral Council from the current members of the existing councils. These individuals understand the collaboration process and have been working hard to get us all here. In May, we will have the discernment meeting with assistance from the archdiocese planning office.

My dream is that many current members of the various councils would help us establish the different commissions needed for Saint Leo the Great, if they are willing to continue their generous service to the church. I will pursue that avenue in the upcoming months. As I have said since the beginning of this process, everyone will have a place in this vibrant Catholic community in Racine.
