## GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

We celebrate Pentecost Sunday, marking the end of the Easter season. This solemnity is the peak of Easter, culminating in the fulfillment of the promises made by the Father and Jesus to the disciples in Jerusalem. They received the Holy Spirit's strength, wisdom, and power to start proclaiming God's Kingdom. I would like us to reflect on two aspects of Pentecost for our church.

First, Pentecost showcases the disciples' openness to all peoples. The Spirit is bestowed upon them to testify about Christ to the whole world, fulfilling Jesus' command before his Ascension. As detailed in Acts, the Holy Spirit's arrival enables the miracle of understanding various languages spoken by the Jerusalem crowds. This event signifies the end of the old Babel division. The followers of Christ create a community where everyone has a place to practice their faith. The Spirit's coming fosters unity and inclusion, which is vital at the Church's beginnings. As we become Saint Leo the Great, we embrace the Lord's call to welcome others and understand one another as members of the Church. This beautiful expression reflects the gift of the Holy Spirit in the unity of the Church.

The second dimension of Pentecost that I want us to meditate on is that the gift of the Holy Spirit marks the beginning of the mission of the early followers of the Lord. The disciples received the power of the Holy Spirit and were "baptized" with fire. The Spirit empowered them to begin bearing witness to Jesus' message. They were no longer afraid or hiding for fear of the Jews. After Pentecost, the Easter fear they had experienced was gone. From now on, they would step up to preach salvation to all. It was a new beginning for them. Today, as disciples of the Lord in the 21st century, what must we do to continue that mission? Today is a day to see whether we can also be ignited by the Holy Spirit to begin bearing witness to Christ in a more intentional and direct way. Let us pray about the ways we can bear witness to Christ in our lives today, in our families, among friends, in the Church, and at work. There shouldn't be fear in us to proclaim and witness Christ to others. We know that the promises of the Lord were fulfilled at Pentecost.

As we enter Ordinary Time, be intentional about fostering unity within our Catholic community and country. We, as Christians, are blessed with the gift of unity that we can share with the world. I also encourage you to witness to the Lord through your life. As summer approaches, numerous opportunities will arise to share your faith at barbecues and other summer gatherings. Don't be afraid; the Holy Spirit has been given to us to strengthen us and draw us nearer to the Lord. Do not hesitate to make disciples of others. Remember, our faith is centered on the person of Christ, not on an idea. Help others find the Lord in their lives.





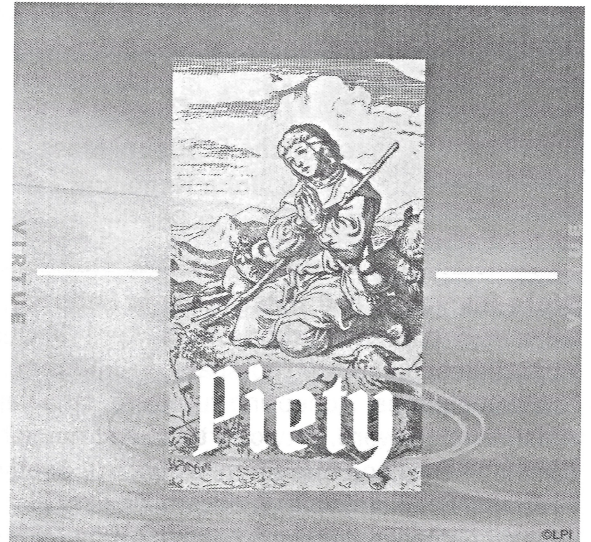
