



GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS

As I listen to the melodies of the many birds that come to the trees close to the farmhouse to sing to the new day, I am reminded of the incredible gift of creation the Lord has given to all of us. How often do we miss the beautiful and simple ways the Lord communicates to us? We, the sons and daughters of Enlightenment, sometimes forget the beauty, the goodness, and the simplicity of God's silent, constant and invisible presence in our midst. This weekend's readings help us regain wisdom to understand, rediscover, and appreciate God's beauty and faithful presence.


This weekend's readings emphasize the need that we all have for wisdom. In the first reading, wisdom prepares a wonderful meal and invites humble people to participate. The key to partaking in wisdom's banquet is humility. The basis for wisdom is the realization that we do not know it all; hence, we need to learn and advance in understanding. Wisdom wants those at her table to eat and drink to grow in the knowledge of God's will. So, I invite you, my friends, to take some time this week to take a humble step towards wisdom. Recognize and pray to the Lord that you need God's wisdom. This simple and humble step opens the fountain of wisdom for us.


Saint Paul also urges the Ephesians to live as wise individuals. He encourages them to reject anything that hinders their understanding of God's revelation in Christ and to cultivate a spirit of gratitude. Gratitude, he asserts, is a hallmark of wisdom. I invite you to express your gratitude to God for his wondrous creation, especially for creating us and all that surrounds us, which is a precious gift. Bring to prayer all the small and big things you are thankful for. This practice helps us recognize that all we are and all we have are gifts from God. It allows us to understand that "in Him, we live and move and have our being," as Saint Paul reminds us when speaking to the Athenians.

The Jews who quarreled against Jesus knew in their minds that a simple man could not come down from heaven and could not give his body and blood as food for eternal life. But, they lacked the wisdom to comprehend the greatness of God, who has worked marvelous deeds in the past, continues to work wonders now, and will forever work marvelous actions for humanity. Their static faith prevents them from seeing what is at work. They lack the imagination and vision of God's work. Let us open the eyes of our hearts to imagine the beautiful deeds the Lord is working in our lives this day. Do not let our rusty faith get in the way of a more extraordinary view and imagination of God's invisible Kingdom working in our midst. I invite you, my friends, to find ways to grow in humility, gratitude, and imagination to live in the Wisdom of God that provides us the path to salvation.
