GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU. MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST

Happy Fourth of July! I hope you had time to relax and enjoy the parade, the fireworks, and time with family and friends. Fourth of July celebrations provide a great time to reflect on our nation's founding principles and freedoms. Sometimes, we take for granted what has gone before us. We are always indebted to our ancestors; some of our ancestors came from other lands and came to this land of opportunities. The first thing I learned about this country is that it is a land of opportunities: opportunities to work hard, to profess one's faith, and to express one's opinions with others. This country has been a melting pot where many have come to live and prosper since 1776.

We need to reclaim those principles because, at times, we forget the reality of our country's history. We forget that we are all connected to our ancestors who came to this land to find opportunities to prosper. When I reflect on freedom, I always remember a challenging conversation with my godfather, a sincere and shrewd man. I was a bit of a case, being the only boy in my family; one day, I said something in terms of "I am free to do whatever I want." My godfather said sure you are but remember that you are free if your freedom does not interfere with someone else's freedom. In other words, he said you are always free to do whatever you want if you respect others as you would like them to respect you. As we celebrate our freedoms, let us appreciate all of God's people in this great nation.

This weekend's Gospel reminds us that Jesus was labeled the carpenter's son. Because of his humble background, no one wanted to believe his wisdom and understanding of God's kingdom. I think the Gospel invites us to listen to and respect everyone equally. We never know when God is speaking to us through other people. The people of the Synagogue were listening to the Son of God himself, but because of their prejudice, they missed the meaning of those wonderful teachings.

As we move forward, I have three top priorities that I want our team of priests to start working on:

- The first is Nursing Homes, Homebound, and Senior Ministry. Fr. Michael will spearhead this initiative to help us create a cohesive program to serve our senior community in those areas. I know some of our deacons and some of you are involved in this ministry. Fr. Michael will accompany you in offering Masses and the sacraments of reconciliation and anointing. He will create a ministry group working on the whole territory with all this in mind.
- Second, Fr. Richter will focus on strengthening our Catholic identity and evangelization in our territory's five Catholic elementary and high schools. In collaboration with Eric Antrim, Fr. Richter will also begin working on a robust young adult ministry for the Family of Eight. If you happen to be a young adult or know a young adult, please have them reach out to Eric at eantrim@stlucychurch.org, because we want to begin this as soon as possible in July.
- The third priority is the Hispanic community. Forty percent of the Catholics in the United States are Hispanics, and it is a fast-growing community. Fr. José Mario will focus on accompanying this community at Saint Patrick's and helping them flourish and grow.

You may be wondering what my focus will be. I am committed to guiding and accompanying all of you in this collaboration process to become a robust and vibrant Catholic community in the Racine area. This collaboration will bring about more excellent opportunities to enhance our faith and grow closer to the Lord than we did before. A living proof of this was our participation in the National Eucharistic Procession. The participation, the vibe, and the energy were so great.


