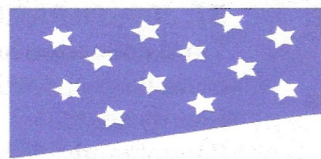

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST

This weekend's Gospel talks about two healing miracles of Jesus in his journey on the other side of the sea. The calming of the storm and these two healings are part of a series of four miracles that Jesus performs in this journey. The two miracles that Jesus performs have a common denominator: Faith. Jairus and the woman, moved by their faith in Jesus, took action to remedy their situation. Jairus comes seeking Jesus to help his daughter. His faith moved him to seek help for his loved one. While Jesus is on the way, the woman with hemorrhages and great faith finds her way around the multitude to touch Jesus. This interruption is a powerful testament to Jesus' compassion and the inclusivity of his ministry. The woman's faith is rewarded when she is healed instantly upon touching Jesus' cloak. This act of faith restores her health and signifies her reintegration into society, free from the stigma of ritual impurity. This narrative encourages us to have unwavering faith and to seek healing and restoration. At the end of the story, both individuals receive restoration from Jesus. Clearly, in these two cases, faith led them to act. This passage from Mark's Gospel invites us to consider the transformative power of faith, mainly when we act to find solutions to our problems. We can also see the boundless compassion of Jesus. It challenges us to believe in the possibility of miracles and to trust in God's ability to bring about healing and renewal in our lives. I invite you to spend some time in prayer, pondering your faith. We may ask: Is my faith strong enough that I am moved to find solutions to my needs? Am I ready to hurry out of my comfort zone, driven by my faith, to meet the Lord and seek healing?

We were part of the National Eucharistic Procession with six stops in the City of Racine. This was an excellent opportunity for all of us to participate in this historic moment in the Catholic Church in the United States. The Eucharistic Revival is an invitation to all of us to grow closer to the Lord and one another. This was an excellent example for us in Racine, since members of all communities participated and came together.
