



# GRACE AND PEACE, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS

Last weekend, we gathered for our first Family of Eight Fun Night, and the turnout was incredible. It was encouraging to see so many people come together with fellow brothers and sisters in Christ. The night was filled with joy and a strong sense of community. Music was played during the games, and people relaxed, talked, and shared time. Thank you to everyone who attended; stay tuned for our upcoming events.

On Monday, we received news that Pope Francis accepted Archbishop Listecki's retirement letter and appointed Bishop Jeffrey S. Grob as the new Archbishop-Designate of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. We are grateful for Archbishop Listecki's faithful service and thank God for our new Archbishop-Designate Grob. As the Vicar for Hispanic Ministry, I participated in the welcoming Mass at the pastoral center, where I had the opportunity to speak with Archbishop-Designate Grob. The transition has begun, and in January, Archbishop-Designate Grob will be installed as our 12<sup>th</sup> Archbishop of Milwaukee. On Tuesday, we had the elections. We pray for our Archdiocese and nation as we navigate this time. As disciples of Christ, we surrender ourselves to his mercy, love, and will. Lord, in You we trust.

This weekend, we find two people of great faith, generosity, and solidarity. The Prophet Elijah received help from a widow with a son who barely had anything to eat. At Elijah's request, she obeyed and trusted in the Lord. Through her generosity, she received abundantly in her life. In the Gospel, Jesus called his disciples' attention to the widow who put all she had in the collection basket. Jesus admires her generosity and commitment. She gave with all her heart. These two widows are portrayed as examples of generosity, solidarity, and humility, contrasting with the rest of the world. It is also a powerful testimony, because widows in the time of Elijah and Jesus came last in the social pyramid. They were marginalized, relegated to the outskirts of society, and not taken into consideration, since they did not have a man to provide for them. Yet, the Sacred Scriptures give us these two women as examples of generosity, solidarity, and commitment.

The widow from Zarephath had lost all hope. She told Elijah that she was going to prepare some food, eat, and die with her son. The prophet reminded her of God's love and care for his people. She trusted in God's providence and provided food for the prophet, and she and her son had food for a whole year. She experienced abundance in her life when she gave away all her food. This is God's mysterious way. When we put all our trust in the Lord, He will provide for us abundantly. The widow at the temple did the same. She gave all she had. She trusted in God's providence, and she was rewarded. Today, I invite my brothers and sisters to look into your life. What do these two widows teach us about generosity, about providence, and about solidarity?

Jesus contrasts the generosity of the widow with the generosity of the rich. Jesus contrasts the humility of the widow with the arrogance of the leaders and scribes. The widow gives all she has, and the rich give from the surplus. The widow humbles herself, and the scribes look for places of privilege. Are we giving to God the surplus of our attention? Are we giving to God the surplus of our time? As we continue this week of our lives, let us stop and think of ways we can be more generous, of ways we can be humbler, of ways that we can show our solidarity to others, of ways that we can trust more in the providence of God.


