



GRACE AND PEACE, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS

Our new Mass schedule is coming up, and I am excited to see how this new schedule helps us enhance our worship experience on the weekends. I know some of you may have mixed feelings about this process, but I am confident in the Grace and Guidance of the Holy Spirit for all of us. We must Pray, Hope, and Trust that God has a plan for us, I invite you that whatever the feelings are, for the love of God, do not allow bitterness to enter your heart. As your pastor and priest, I will be very sad if this process will make your hearts bitter. I would have failed as your spiritual guide. Whenever I am frustrated with something, my spiritual director implores me not to allow bitterness to take over my heart. So, today, I implore you to do so.

Remember, the schedule comes into place on the weekend of November 30 and December 1, 2024. This is the first weekend of Advent. The new schedule is available in bulletins, online, and in print in our parishes. Make sure to take some time to check it to know when to go to Mass on Saturday, November 30, and Sunday, December 1. I invite those who participate in ministries (Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Lectors, Ushers, etc.) at your current sites for a specific Mass that no longer exists in the new schedule to contact any parish office to learn how to help at that location which you want to serve. I also invite those already serving in those ministries to welcome any new help with love and understanding as we collaborate. As for the daily Mass schedule, it is staying the same. The only change in the Mass schedule is for the weekends.

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, we hear Jesus' teachings on the end times and the signs of those times in the Gospel. This is not to scare us or make us anxious; it is just to remind us of the importance of being vigilant and committed to the Lord. Our consolation and hope are found in the lasting nature of Jesus' words and God's never-ending love for us. That's our hope. But, before we consider Jesus' words, it is essential to note the political backdrop against which many think Mark's Gospel was written. Scholars agree that Mark's Gospel was written for a community living in or near Rome about 30 to 40 years after the death of Jesus. This was a time of political turmoil in Rome. Some Christians experienced persecution by the Romans during the reign of the Emperor Nero. Jewish revolutionaries rebelled against the Romans, which led the Romans to destroy the Temple in Jerusalem in 70 A.D. In this time of political turmoil and persecution, many in Mark's community might have wondered if the end times predicted by Jesus were, in fact, quite near. Anxiety, worries, and stress were always high, and Jesus' promise of his second coming sounded very hopeful at this time. Again, the Christians hope for a better future amid tribulations.

In today's Gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. His words and images draw upon Old Testament imagery, especially images found in the Book of Daniel. Next, Jesus offers the fig tree lesson, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. Jesus also teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come except the Father. Our invitation for this weekend is not to despair, even if things seem rough. The one virtue that we Christians draw strength from is hope. Hope helps us endure challenging moments in the present and allows us to face the future with peace of mind and heart. If you feel right now that the world, as you know it, is coming to an end, I encourage you to pray to the Holy Spirit to grant you hope in your life. Say a short prayer like Lord, you are my hope. Lord in you, I hope.
