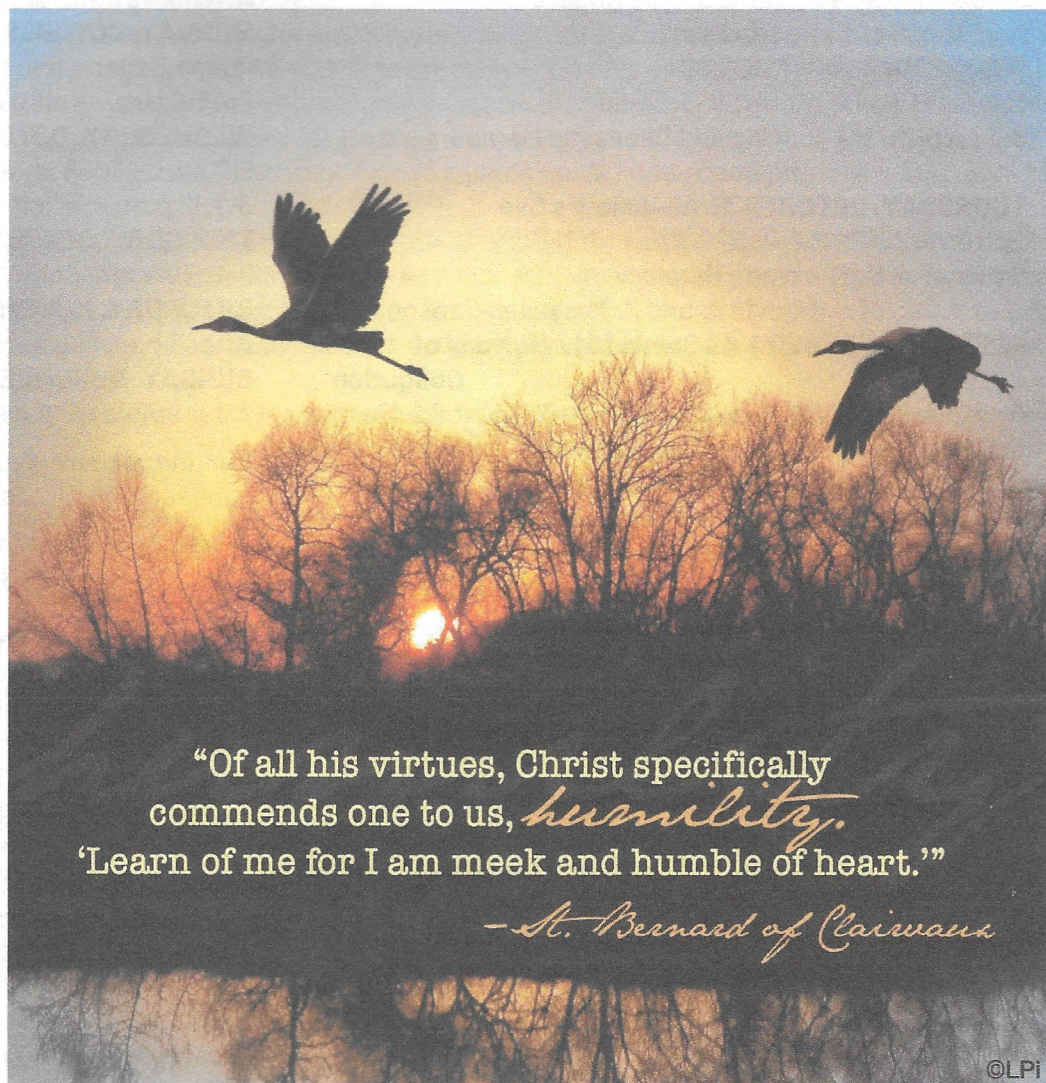

Venerable Anne de Guigné (1911-1922) had a profound understanding of Jesus' presence in the Holy Sacrament. She developed a strong personal relationship with Jesus, declaring that she loved to talk with "little Jesus."

Prayer for Courage

"Take courage," we hear,
"Jesus is calling you!"
Jesus, give me the grace to
respond to your call — your
invitation to what I don't
understand, to the unknown,
the mystery. In these spaces,
your grace abounds. Be with
me, give me courage!
Amen.

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS

As Jesus leaves Jericho, journeying to Jerusalem, he encounters a blind beggar named Bartimaeus on the way. This is a beautiful encounter in which Bartimaeus recovers his sight and becomes a follower of Jesus. The healing comes about due to great faith and persistence on Bartimaeus' part. As I meditate on the passage, three themes emerge: faith, persistence, and transformation when encountering Jesus.

Mark tells us that Bartimaeus is sitting by the roadside outside Jericho on the way to Jerusalem. He hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, and despite the opposition from the crowds and the attempts to silence him, he cries out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" What a tense moment; his only chance to be healed is passing by, and the crowds are not helping. Have you felt that alone? Imagine how Bartimaeus felt. All the voices and noise drowned his plea for help. However, in his great need for healing, we can see his firm faith that encourages him to seek Jesus. He knows that he needs healing that only comes from Jesus. He acts on his faith and gets the opportunity to meet the Lord.

Bartimaeus is an excellent example of a person of faith. Nothing gets in his way of finding help in Jesus. In our own lives, how often do we find ourselves in situations where we feel overlooked or marginalized? Like Bartimaeus, we may struggle with physical, emotional, or spiritual blindness. Today's gospel invites us to cry out to Jesus to voice our needs without fear of judgment. Bartimaeus teaches us that faith often requires vulnerability and a willingness to be heard.

The crowd's rebuke is a significant moment in the narrative. They tell Bartimaeus to be quiet, yet he shouts even louder. This determination illustrates a crucial lesson: obstacles to our faith will always exist, whether from external sources or our doubts. Bartimaeus models the courage to persist in the face of discouragement. In our faith journey, we may encounter voices that tell us to remain silent or to doubt our worthiness. It is essential to remember that Jesus hears us despite these voices. He sees us and values our cries for help. As we face our challenges, let us find the strength to push past the noise, embracing our identity as beloved children of God.

When Jesus calls Bartimaeus to him, Jesus asks, "What do you want me to do for you?" This question is both simple and profound. Bartimaeus responds with clarity, asking to regain his sight. His request is not just for physical healing but symbolizes a more profound desire for spiritual enlightenment and a relationship with Christ. Bartimaeus' healing is not just about sight; it is about restoration to the community and a new beginning. When Jesus heals him, he restores his physical sight and transforms his life purpose—Bartimaeus becomes a follower. He is no longer a beggar. He is now a disciple, a follower of the Lord on the way. This is a massive transformation from beggar to disciple. He throws off his mantle of a beggar and begins a life of discipleship. What mantles do we need to leave behind to become followers of the Lord on the way?

As we reflect on this passage, we are reminded that the healing we seek is often intertwined with our call to discipleship. Bartimaeus does not merely receive a miracle; he responds by following Jesus. This calls us to consider how we can respond to God's grace. Take some time this week to ponder that.
