



GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS

This week, we find in the Gospel Jesus providing a solid teaching that changes the provision of Moses. Jesus's stand on divorce becomes a countercultural teaching. In the Jewish and Greco-Roman cultures of the time, divorce was permissible and a simple act that provided an advantage to the man. In a society that seems to take lightly the dignity of women and the depth of relationships, Jesus brings about the original intent of God for humanity: "Male and female God created them"—the human dignity in creation and the equal intent for humans in God's plan. The law of divorce that the Pharisees refer to in their debate with Jesus permitted men to divorce a woman for minor reasons, but the woman couldn't. Jesus refers to the hardness of the heart as the reason for Moses to allow such a thing. For Jesus, his teachings are a reclaiming of the intrinsic value that men and women have as creatures of God. For Jesus, humanity has gone far from God's ideal for them in the realm of relationships, and he wants to remind everyone of the beauty of God's intent for them. He then strengthens the result of relationships built in love, equality, and mutual understanding that the two shall become "one flesh." Jesus makes the debate about justice, the beauty of God's plan for humanity, and the obtuse hearts that close themselves to God's plan. Today, in our society, we must ask ourselves: What are some of the injustices we must rectify to reclaim God's original intent in this world? In what ways have we hardened our hearts to God's plan? What would be something beautiful that God gave us, but we made ugly?

Mark also connects this teaching with the teaching about children. Jesus welcomes and stands for those that society tends to overlook and those with no voice. Jesus wants the disciples to understand that God's Kingdom is a pure gift and must be received as such. He uses the children as an example of a group of people who accept everything as a gift, since they cannot do anything to obtain what they need. It is a humbling experience for all of us to understand that God provides us with gifts we do not deserve. The teachings about divorce and children remind us today that God has had a loving relationship with us since the beginning of the world, but sometimes, our sinfulness gets in the way. We are invited to look hopefully into God's original intent for us and see how to find our way back into God. This is the journey of every one of us, and it requires a conversion of heart (softening the heart) and faith like that of a child (total dependence) to find the way back to total unity with God. Where are you on this journey?
