



TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

AUGUST 17, 2025 | 05

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

This Sunday's readings confront us with the bold and sometimes uncomfortable truth of discipleship. Jesus declares in the Gospel of Luke, "I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already blazing!" His words challenge the notion of peace as mere comfort, revealing instead a deeper call to transformation, even division, for the sake of following his call. We can also see a remnant of last Sunday's message: what we value the most is what we love. If our hearts are in the Lord, then we must follow his command to love one another.

The readings center on the cost of discipleship and the courage required to be a prophetic witness. Jeremiah's suffering in the cistern is a vivid image of the rejection prophets often face. Yet his rescue reminds us that God does not abandon his faithful servants. Jeremiah is not afraid to speak God's truth and will. In Hebrews, we are urged to persevere, inspired by the "great cloud of witnesses" who have gone before us. This race of faith is not without struggle, but it is sustained by the example of Christ, who endured the cross for our sake. Jesus' words in Luke are startling. He speaks not of peace, but of fire and division. This is not a call to conflict for its own sake, but a recognition that truth often disrupts comfort. The Gospel demands a decision, a willingness to stand with Christ even when it sets us apart.

This weekend's message is particularly relevant to the current times we are living in. We no longer live in a Christian society that promotes the Christian values that respect the human dignity of each person as created in the image and likeness of God. We live in apostolic times. Once again, like the early disciples, we are called to witness Christ in the world. We Christians are called to be prophetic, like Jeremiah, who stood up to speak God's truth. What would be a prophetic act that you can do this week?

This week, consider practicing the following:

Be courageous: Like Jeremiah, be faithful to Christ and speak truth with love, even when it's unpopular.

Persevere in faith: Let the witness of saints and fellow believers encourage you in your journey of faith. This week, read a story about a saint, drawing from their example the courage you need to continue your call to holiness.

Embrace the fire: Let the Holy Spirit ignite your heart with zeal for God's kingdom. Invite the Holy Spirit to help you stand for a particular value of the kingdom of God this week.


