## GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

This weekend marks our final festival of the season. At Saint Patrick's, we will have the opportunity to enjoy authentic Mexican food. If you are looking for a plan on Saturday or Sunday evening, come and join our brothers and sisters at Saint Patrick's for our festival. I will be riding the dancing horses once again on Sunday at 4:30 PM.

This weekend's readings are a call to journey from vanity to generosity, as a way of growing in trust and closer to God. The Scripture confronts us with a sobering truth: the pursuit of wealth and self-centered ambition can lead us far from the presence of God. The message is clear and urgent: Vanity and greed are not just moral failings; they are spiritual distractions that blind us to what truly matters.

The first reading from Ecclesiastes opens with the haunting refrain: "Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!" The author, traditionally identified as Qoheleth, reflects on the futility of labor and the emptiness of accumulating wealth for its own sake. His words echo across the centuries, challenging us to examine the motivations behind our actions. Are we building lives centered on God, or are we chasing after the wind? The invitation is to grow in our lives in total dependency and trust in God.


In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the rich fool, a man who hoards his harvest, builds bigger barns, and plans to "eat, drink, and be merry," only to die that very night. His fatal error is not his success, but his self-absorption. He fails to recognize that all he has is a gift from God, meant to be shared. Jesus warns, "Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God." As a farmer, I have found this passage always compelling. I understand the joy of the man who harvests abundantly; what I do not understand is the lack of awareness that all this was achieved through the help of God and others.

These readings invite us to a radical reorientation of our lives. The antidote to vanity and greed is found in generosity, trust, and self-giving. When we loosen our grip on possessions and open our hearts to others, we begin to reflect the image of Christ, who gave himself completely for our sake. To be "rich in what matters to God" means cultivating a spirit of detachment, trusting that God will provide, and using our blessings to serve others. It means living not for ourselves, but for the Kingdom. In doing so, we discover a more profound joy, one that no earthly treasure can match.

This week, I invite you to work hard on a life that walks the path of generosity and trust—a life rooted in love, mercy, and eternal purpose. Pray and think about how you can do that.


