



THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

JUNE 1, 2025 | 05

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. This profound moment speaks to both hope and mission, offering reassurance and a call to action for all believers. When the disciples saw Jesus ascend, they might have felt an initial sense of loss, but the Ascension was not an absence but a fulfillment. Jesus' departure was not an ending but a beginning. He did not leave them orphaned; instead, he ascended to be with the Father, opening the way for the Holy Spirit to descend upon them at Pentecost. With the Ascension, the Lord opened the way to his disciples to continue his mission with the assurance of their receiving the Holy Spirit during Pentecost.

This moment is rich in hope because it reassures us that Christ is not gone; he reigns in glory, interceding for us. His promise is clear: "I am with you always, until the end of the age". The hope of the Ascension is the assurance that we are never alone. Jesus is present in his Church, in his Sacraments, and in the guidance of the Holy Spirit. This beautiful promise is fulfilled daily in our lives. The Lord is with you and me, my brothers and sisters. Contemplate this truth this week, especially when you feel alone and lost amid daily problems.


The two men in white spoke these words of mission: "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?". These words are a reminder that faith is not passive. Jesus ascends, but he does not leave his disciples without direction. Instead, he entrusts them with a mission: "You will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth". This is also the mission that we receive today. Instead of Men of Galilee, place your name in that phrase and meditate on how you can be a witness to Christ today.

The Ascension marks a shift from simply following Jesus to carrying his message to the world. The disciples are sent forth, empowered by the Spirit, to proclaim the Gospel and build the Kingdom of God on earth. This is graduation time for the Apostles and disciples of the Lord. Now, they must step into their new role as witnesses to the Lord. And this mission extends to us today. The Church is not called to wait for Christ's return in idleness but to work, to be a living testimony of his love, mercy, and salvation.

The Ascension challenges us to embrace hope and mission, to trust in Christ's presence while stepping forward as his witnesses. Hope gives us confidence that we are never abandoned, that Christ reigns, and that his Spirit sustains us. Mission urges us to act, to evangelize, and to serve, knowing that the world still longs for Christ's light, as Pope Leo XIV reminded us in his opening remarks. As we celebrate this solemnity, let us lift our eyes to heaven in hope but keep our feet firmly planted in the mission he has entrusted to us.

Dear Friends in Christ,

During this Easter season, we are reminded of the transformation, the newness of life, and the joy that emanates from the fact that our Lord Jesus Christ rose from the dead. We are witnesses to this remarkable truth of our faith. Today, I want to share some news and updates about our future as a Catholic community in Racine. We began our journey of collaboration last July 2024. We started with 21 Masses on the weekend, with 2800 people attending Mass on the weekends. Now, nine months later, with 16 Masses on the weekend, we have 3200 people coming to Mass. This is an increase of 400 people. You probably have experienced it on your pews. More people. Praise Jesus Christ! We have a robust young adult ministry; we created events to bring the community together to get to know each other. We come together in prayer at our Food for the Journey events, and we also have a new marriage preparation initiative called Witness to Love. The collaboration fosters a sense of vibrancy, offers opportunities to grow spiritually, learn about the Lord and our faith, and be a joyful group of disciples within our communities. When we began this journey, the Lord Jesus Christ and all of us walked the streets of Racine in a magnificent Eucharistic procession that touched and transformed many lives and broke down walls of division, creating one Eucharistic community. These are the fruits of that amazing moment last summer.

Even though we have achieved so many wonderful things, let me share our current administrative reality. We have eight parishes, eight different pastoral councils, eight different finance councils, eight different staff teams, and eight sets of trustees. As you can see, it is an administrative, time-consuming machine. My energy, time, and passion go into managing all these parishes.

We have been working hard with our Planning Team, Pastoral Councils, Finance Councils, and Trustees. We believe that to manage this great Catholic community in Racine effectively, we need to create an administrative structure that provides the excellent support necessary to proclaim the Gospel of Christ and fulfill his mandate to make disciples of all peoples. One possibility would be to merge the eight existing parishes into one new parish with a fresh canonical and civic identity. If merged, the new parish would have a new name. Any possible merger would not entail closing any buildings at this point, but instead would create an administrative structure to support the incredible vibrancy we are already experiencing. Therefore, we could merge into one parish with eight different sites. Each site would maintain its current name and mass schedule, and there would be office hours to provide services to you, my brothers and sisters, at each site. Thus, the change would be more internal than external, more administrative. You, my brothers and sisters in the pews, would not be affected by this change. We would continue with our same Mass schedule, our sites would keep their beloved names, and each site would have office hours to provide the services you need. Simplifying the complex structure we currently have would help me have more time to focus on the mission of making disciples.

If approved by Archbishop Grob, the proposed merger could happen in July 2026. To achieve this timeline, we need to write a letter to the Archbishop asking for his approval to merge after he undertakes the required canonical consultation. We will need to work on the details for any future merger. I ask you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for this process, which I believe is guided by the Holy Spirit. We are all in the hands of God. This is a journey that we do together, trusting in the Lord. If you have any concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me. My email is on the bulletin, and I am always ready to listen to you. My excellent staff, planning team, pastoral council, trustees, and finance council members will also be prepared to answer any questions.
