THE SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, also known as the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This is a profound celebration of the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Instituted in the 13th century, this feast invites us to pause and reflect on the mystery and miracle that takes place at every Mass: Christ truly present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, under the appearance of bread and wine.

Every time we celebrate this solemnity, it brings great memories from my childhood and late grandfather. In my hometown, there was a procession around the town, and different offerings were brought to celebrate this important feast. My grandfather would spend a few weeks before this solemnity preparing the gifts he would get to offer the Lord on this day. Mostly, his gifts came from his farm and his sacred hobby, hunting. He would catch several animals and bring them to present as an offering. Usually, people would buy all that, and then the parish would get the cash from all the great gifts people brought that day. As the procession with the Blessed Sacrament went around the town and the main square where all the people had placed their offerings, Christ would bless them. It was a wonderful and profound moment of faith and devotion to the Lord. The day was imbued with a sense of reverence and mystery.

Now that I am older, with all our technological advances, we seem to live in a world that often seeks tangible proof and visible signs--a world that wants to be rid of the mystery and the beauty of the unknown. Just like the Most Holy Trinity, Corpus Christi is a mystery we approach with awe, love, and reverence. Just as the Most Holy Trinity is a great sign of unity and communion, the Eucharist is a quiet, powerful testimony of our faith. I love that we are doing processions in all our parishes this year. This brings me back to my childhood and is a marvelous testimony of our Catholic presence in our city. We walk the streets of our neighborhoods praying that Christ's presence brings blessings to those we encounter.

Corpus Christi is a mystery transcending human understanding, yet it is also deeply personal and intimate. Each time we receive the Eucharist, we are united with Christ and one another in a communion that nourishes our souls and our mission as disciples. Corpus Christi is a celebration of Christ's presence and a call to become what we receive. Saint Augustine once said, "Behold what you are, become what you receive." The Eucharist transforms us into the Body of Christ in the world, called to serve, love, and bring hope to others.

This feast also reminds us of the importance of reverence and gratitude. How often do we approach the altar in a routine fashion rather than with awe? Corpus Christi invites us to renew our devotion, to adore Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, and to allow his presence to shape our lives. As we celebrate this solemnity, may we be drawn deeper into the mystery of the Eucharist and recommit ourselves to living as faithful witnesses of Christ's love in the world.

I invite you to join one of our processions. As you walk with Christ, let us pray for our families, community, city, and world, asking the Lord to bring peace and harmony to our lives.
