

## GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU. MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS

The theme for this Lent is **Lent: A Journey to Renewal.** I would like us to draw from the Scriptures for each Sunday of Lent and focus on a specific habit to change or develop each week. By reflecting on the Word of God and committing to positive changes, we can deepen our faith and draw closer to Christ.

**First Sunday of Lent:** Temptation in the Wilderness (Luke 4:1-13). The devil tempts Jesus in the wilderness. Jesus overcomes each temptation through steadfast faith and reliance on God's Word. Habit to work on: **Resist Temptation**. Identify a specific temptation or habit that leads you away from God. Commit to resisting this temptation through prayer, scripture reading, and accountability.

**Second Sunday of Lent:** The Transfiguration (Luke 9:28b- 36). Jesus is transfigured on the mountain, revealing his divine glory to Peter, James, and John. Habit to work on: **Seek God's Presence.** Dedicate time each day to experience God's presence through prayer, meditation, or contemplation of God's creation. Allow yourself to be transformed by his glory.

**Third Sunday of Lent:** The Fig Tree (Luke 13:1-9). Jesus tells the parable of the barren fig tree and emphasizes the importance of repentance and bearing fruit. Habit to work on: **Cultivate Spiritual Growth.** Identify an area of your spiritual life that needs growth. Commit to nurturing this area through practices like Bible study, attending Mass, or participating in a small group.

**Fourth Sunday of Lent:** The Prodigal Son (Luke 15:1–3, 11–32). Jesus shares the parable of the prodigal son, highlighting the themes of repentance, forgiveness, and God's boundless mercy. Habit to work on: **Practice Forgiveness**. Reflect on any grudges or unforgiveness you may be holding onto. Make a conscious effort to forgive others and seek reconciliation where needed.

**Fifth Sunday of Lent:** The Woman Caught in Adultery (John 8:1-11). Jesus forgives the woman caught in adultery and encourages her to "go and sin no more." Habit to work on: **Extend Grace and Compassion.** Focus on extending grace and compassion to others, especially those who may have wronged you. Remember that we are all recipients of God's mercy and are called to share it with others.

**Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion:** (Luke 19:28-40; 22:14-23:56). Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, followed by his Passion and Crucifixion. Habit to work on: **Embrace Sacrifice**. Reflect on the sacrifices Jesus made for us. Identify ways you can sacrifice your time, resources, or comforts to serve others and deepen your relationship with Christ.

As we journey through Lent with the theme of renewal, let us intentionally make positive changes in our lives. By focusing on a specific habit each week and drawing strength from the Scriptures, we can grow in our faith and become missionary disciples of the Lord. Let us make this Lenten season a holy season of renewal for all of us.




