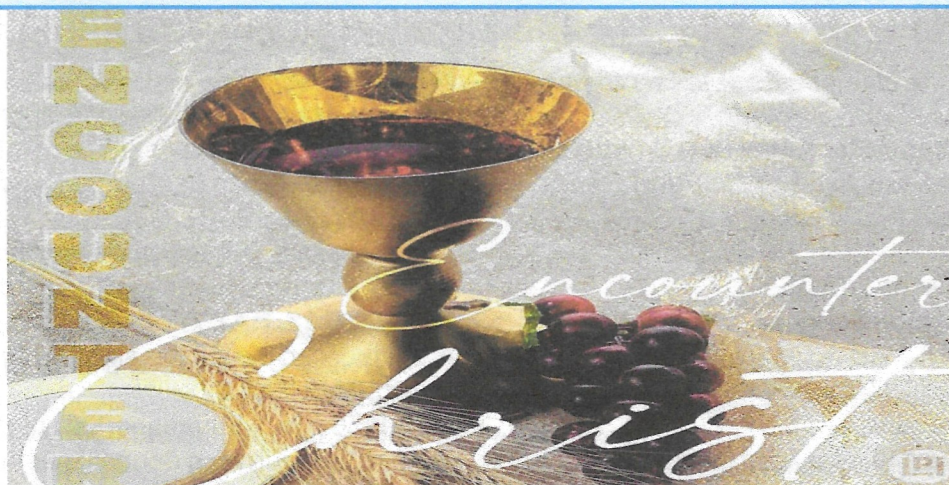

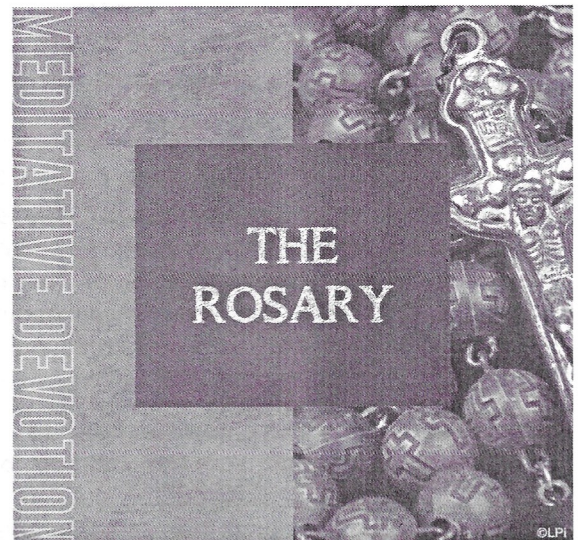

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

The Third Sunday of Easter offers a profound opportunity to reflect on Peter's leadership and the disciples' journey from despair to renewed mission. After the tragic events in Jerusalem, the disciples, including Peter, struggled with hopelessness and uncertainty. They were unsure about their future. They returned to their ordinary lives, fishing on the Sea of Galilee, perhaps feeling disconnected from the extraordinary calling they had once embraced. They left Jerusalem broken and defeated. In the following days until the Ascension, we find the Lord calling his disciples again to follow him and fulfill his mission of making the Reign of God a reality.

In the Gospel for this weekend, Jesus appears to his disciples on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. This time, Jesus guides them back to their mission. His presence is transformative for the disciples. He provides for their physical needs by preparing breakfast. What a beautiful and intimate moment the Lord has with his disciples. This moment of intimacy with the Lord reignites their spiritual purpose. This encounter on the shore reminds them of the first time Jesus met them and called them to follow him a few years back. This moment enkindles their hearts with the flame of discipleship. When they are all together, Peter's leadership is particularly highlighted as Jesus asks him three times, "Do you love me?" This mirrors Peter's threefold denial and serves as a moment of redemption and recommissioning. Jesus entrusts Peter with the responsibility to "feed my sheep," reaffirming his role as the shepherd of the early community of followers.

This encounter reminds us that even in moments of doubt and failure, the Lord seeks us out, offering forgiveness and calling us back to our mission. It is a powerful testament to the enduring hope and renewal that the Resurrection brings. As Easter people, we are invited to embrace this hope and recommit ourselves to sharing this great news. This week, try to find a moment of intimacy with the Lord. If your heart is fainting, reconnecting in intimacy with the Lord will fuel your passion and desire to become a joyful disciple of the Resurrection.

This week, we are having the Spring Assembly of Priests (Monday through Wednesday). This is an excellent opportunity for all of us to connect with our Archbishop. Please pray for all the priests gathering there this week and for the speakers so that the Holy Spirit inspires them to speak the words that the Lord wants us to hear. I also ask you to pray to the Holy Spirit for the Conclave, the election of the new Pope. Let us pray:

**Come, Holy Spirit,
fill the hearts of your faithful,
and kindle in them the fire of your love.
Send forth your Spirit, and they shall be created.
And you will renew the face of the earth.**
**Lord, you are our eternal shepherd and guide.
In your mercy, grant your Church
a shepherd who will walk in your ways
and whose watchful care will bring us your blessing.
We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever. Amen.**
