

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

NOVEMBER 23, 2025 | 05

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU. MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS.

This Sunday, we celebrate the **Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe**, the final Sunday of the liturgical year. We come to the end of this liturgical year in joy, knowing that we have made some growth in our journey as disciples. And now we prepare to begin the season of Advent, another liturgical year and opportunity to grow as missionary disciples of Christ.

At first glance, the title "King" in the Solemnity we celebrate this weekend might evoke images of power, wealth, and domination, just like earthly kingdoms that often exclude, divide, and protect privilege. But the Gospel reveals a very different kind of kingship: one rooted in **compassion and mercy**. The Kingdom of God is driven by Love, unlike earthly kingdoms that are driven by power and ambition.

The Gospel of Luke presents a powerful image of Christ's kingship. Jesus reigns from a cross, not a throne. His crown is of thorns, not gold. Around him are not courtiers but criminals. In this scene, we encounter two thieves crucified alongside him. One mocks, demanding power and escape. The other, in humility, turns to Jesus with a simple plea: "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." And Jesus responds with astonishing mercy: "Today you will be with me in Paradise." This moment unveils the heart of Christ's Kingdom. It is not a realm of exclusion or privilege, but a kingdom that welcomes the repentant, heals the broken, and embraces the outcast. Unlike earthly nations that draw borders and build walls, the Kingdom of God gathers people together — saints and sinners alike — under the banner of grace. It is a kingdom where forgiveness triumphs over judgment and love conquers hatred.

The "good thief" reminds us that entry into this kingdom is not earned by status or achievement, but by trust in Jesus. His simple act of faith opens the gates of Paradise. This is the hope offered to all of us: no matter our failures, Christ's mercy is greater. His kingship is not about domination but **service**, not about fear but **freedom**, not about exclusion but **embrace**. This weekend, feel the embrace of Christ in your life and liberate your heart from fear and


anxiety, for the Lord wants you to be with him in Paradise.

As we conclude the liturgical year, this Solemnity invites us to examine our own hearts. Do we live as citizens of this kingdom of mercy? Do our words and actions reflect Christ's compassion? In a world fractured by division and rivalry, we are called to be signs of unity and peace, ambassadors of a King who reigns through love. As ambassadors of Christ that we are, let us do this week one action that reflects Jesus' love, compassion, and mercy in this world.

Let us proclaim with joy: **Christ is our King!** But let us also remember what kind of King he is, the one who forgives from the cross, who welcomes the sinner, who binds up the wounded. His kingdom is already among us whenever we choose mercy over judgment, compassion over indifference, and reconciliation over division. May this solemnity renew our commitment to live under Christ's gentle rule, and to extend his mercy to all. For in his kingdom, no one is forgotten, and everyone is invited to share in the life of grace.



Great news!

You can now purchase scrip from the convenience of your home and while you are on the go by either ordering from your computer or from the app on your phone!

You can participate in SCRIP online with E-gift card delivery, reload your existing gift cards that you purchased through the SCRIP program (which is instant after you place your order), and/or have physical gift cards mailed directly to your home.

This is a completely safe and easy way to participate in the SJN SCRIP Program! It is also a way to order the higher amount cards such as \$100.00 Gas Cards.

- E-gift cards there are over 750 vendors to choose from, including Amazon, Target, Kohls, Home Depot, Walmart, Starbucks, etc.
- 2. Ship to Home there are 220 vendors to choose from including, Amazon, Panera, Speedway, Target, to name a few.

Following are the instructions on creating the app on your phone. If you have already created an online account, you can skip over the steps that direct you how to "Join a Program", you will simply need to add the app and sign in with your existing account information.

Step 1: Get your enrollment code



To sign up and tie your earnings to the correct fundraising program, you will be asked for your organization's unique enrollment code. If you don't have this, you can request it from your program's coordinator.

in addition to the enrollment code, you only need a few more details to sign up, including:

- □ First and last name
- Email address
- Phone number (for 2-step verification)

Step 2: Sign up online
