THE FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

NOVEMBER 9, 2025 | 05

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome is celebrated annually on November 9 and holds profound significance for Catholics worldwide. Though it commemorates the consecration of a specific building, the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran, the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, it is much more than a local Roman feast. It is a universal celebration of the unity and communion of the Church.

The Lateran Basilica is the mother and head of all churches in Rome and the world. As the cathedral of the Pope, it symbolizes his pastoral authority and the unity of the Church under his leadership. Its dedication reminds the faithful that the Church is not merely a collection of buildings, but a living temple of believers, built upon the foundation of the apostles, with Christ as the cornerstone. This profound reality of us as the living temple for the Holy Spirit impacts us deeply in our lives. Ever since I learned this concept from Saint Paul's writings, I have been fascinated by how I can bring it to life. Think for a moment of you as a living temple of the Holy Spirit. What would need to change in your life to live this call fully?


This feast encourages reflection on the **spiritual significance of the Church as the Body of Christ**, this beautiful image that Paul shared with us in the Letter to the Corinthians. The physical structure of the Lateran Basilica points to the deeper reality of the Church as a community of believers, called to be holy and united. The readings for this feast highlight the sacredness of the Church and the call to holiness. If we are the Body of Christ, the Church, then we are all compelled by our baptism to strive to live in holiness and to bring unity to all God's people.

We live in today's challenging times, a divided world; these divisions and tensions can also arise within the Church. This feast is a powerful reminder of our **shared identity and mission**. It calls all Catholics, whether in Rome or in any other corner of the world, to renew their commitment to unity in faith, worship, and charity. The Lateran Basilica stands as a visible sign of the Church's **apostolic continuity**, rooted in the ministry of Peter and his successors.

Ultimately, the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica is a celebration of the Church as a **spiritual home** for all people, a place of encounter with God, and a community of love and truth. It challenges us to be **living stones** in the Church, united in Christ, and committed to building up the Body of Christ in the world. This week, I invite you to ask yourself: How am I contributing to the growth of the Body of Christ in this world? What should I do to be a witness to unity and communion within the Church?


