

### GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

This weekend's Gospel offers us a profound lesson in healing, gratitude, and the radical inclusivity of God's love. As Jesus travels toward Jerusalem, he encounters ten lepers who stand at a distance and plead, "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" Their cry is not only for physical healing but also for a restoration of dignity and belonging, since leprosy had separated them from their families and communities.

Jesus responds not with elaborate rituals, but with a simple directive: "Go show yourselves to the priests." In trusting obedience, all ten go and are healed on the way. Yet, only one returns, praising God and falling at Jesus' feet to thank him. This grateful man is a Samaritan, a foreigner, someone doubly marginalized in Jewish society. Jesus asks pointedly, "Were not ten made clean? Where are the other nine?" The Samaritan's act is more than mere courtesy; it is a deep recognition of both the gift and the Giver. His gratitude becomes worship, and Jesus affirms, "Your faith has saved you."

Here, the Gospel reveals that gratitude is a transformative force. The nine received physical restoration and acceptance, but only the one who returned received the deeper gift, salvation, and an intimate encounter with Christ. Gratitude moves us from simply receiving to engaging with the source of our blessings, opening our hearts to God and to others. It reshapes our perspective, cultivating humility and receptivity. When we give thanks, we acknowledge our dependence on God and recognize the interconnectedness of our lives.

Inclusivity is at the heart of this story. The Samaritan's gratitude bridges divides, including those of a religious, ethnic, and social nature. He becomes a model of faith, not despite his outsider status, but because he recognizes that God's mercy is for all. "God shows no partiality," Saint Paul would tell us, and the Gospel urges us to extend grace beyond our usual circles.

Gratitude also shapes our daily interactions. It softens judgments, inspires generosity, and fosters real community. When we make the effort to thank a colleague, comfort a friend, or appreciate a family member's effort, we create


an environment where healing and connection can flourish. Even in challenging situations, such as conflict or disappointment, a posture of gratitude can shift our focus from what's lacking to what is possible.

This week, I invite you to reflect deeply on the story of the ten lepers. Consider these questions: In what ways have you experienced healing or mercy, and how have you responded with gratitude? Who in your life might feel like an outsider, and how can you extend grace and inclusion to them? How might a spirit of gratitude transform your relationships and your community?

As you meditate on Jesus' words, "Your faith has saved you", let them echo in your heart. Gratitude is not limited to moments of abundance; it is a way of seeing and engaging the world that brings us closer to God and each other. May we, like the grateful Samaritan, turn back to Christ again and again, not only with our needs, but also with thanksgiving. And in doing so, may we discover the healing and welcoming message of the Gospel.




