

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

Many things in life begin as dreams, their realization far from our present situation, yet worthy of the effort necessary to bring them to life. When I became the pastor of the Catholic Community of Eight, I thought that it would be great for the city of Racine if we were to have a Catholic festival in Festival Park downtown. The dream was to go into the heart of Racine and show everyone that we Catholics are here and can be the salt and the light of this city. It was a dream. It was a vision to establish our presence in the city. Of course, dreams need to be confronted with reality.

There are 13,700 of us Catholics within the boundaries of the Catholic Community of Eight in Racine. That's a considerable portion of the population of the Racine area. The reality in 2024 and 2025 has been that we are eight independent parishes. Of these eight parishes, two have festivals: Saint Lucy and Saint Patrick. In 2024 and 2025, both parishes had very successful festivals. I am grateful to all the leaders and volunteers who poured their hearts and passion into making those festivals a great success for us.

As we now advance in our collaboration process towards the merger of our eight wonderful parishes, the Catholic festival dream can come to fruition. I am pleased to announce that we are planning a large and beautiful festival for the Community of Eight in Festival Park next year. This will be an excellent opportunity for all of us to come together and work together. There will no longer be individual Catholic festivals in Racine, but one great Catholic festival, which will take place on June 26, 27, and 28, 2026. Please save those dates.


Now, the success of the festival will depend on the participation of each of the communities within our family of eight. There will be more details to come, but I dream that each community takes a parcel/area of the festival and provides the leadership and volunteers to make that area a success. This is an excellent opportunity for all to build the Body of Christ here in Racine. In our Catholic Community of Eight, we are no longer passive participants or spectators, but we are the leaven and ferment of the Community. We will all make this dream a reality with our sweat, passion, time, and energy. On Sunday, June 28, we will have a Mass on the Festival Park grounds to highlight that what we do, we do for Christ and His Body, the Church. The Mass will be a testament to our faith in the city.

In this weekend's Gospel, the disciples ask the Lord to help them "increase their faith". They are scared by the monumental task of being his disciples and followers, helping him make the Kingdom of God a reality. They think that what they have is not enough and that they need more. Jesus, instead of entertaining their request, replies with a story that invites them to reflect on what they have and gain the confidence that they need to fulfill the task. Their faith is the presence of God's incredible power in their hearts. That's enough for them to work wonders. They need to believe in themselves and tap into the powerful gift of faith. If they do that, they will be able to be good and faithful servants.

I know that a large Catholic festival may seem to be a monumental task, but we are a great group of faithful disciples of the Lord. In God, there is nothing we can't do if we open our hearts to the creative, redemptive, transformational power of God.


Devotions, Explained!
