

FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

SEPTEMBER 14, 2025 | 05

GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

On September 14th, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, a day that invites us to gaze upon the Cross not as a symbol of defeat, but as the ultimate sign of God's victorious love. This year, September 14th falls on a Sunday, and hence we celebrate the feast on this weekend. This is the Christian paradox: the instrument of suffering, the cross, becomes the throne of glory, and death becomes the gateway to life. We know that after the suffering of Good Friday, we celebrate the Resurrection on Easter Sunday. Suffering and death are not the end but the gateway to fullness of life.

At the heart of this feast is the mystery of divine love, a love so profound that it embraces suffering for the sake of the beloved. In Christ crucified, we see the depth of God's love for humanity, a love that does not shy away from pain, rejection, or sacrifice. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son..." (John 3:16). The Cross is the visible proof of that gift.

But this feast is not only about what Christ has done; it is also a call to imitate his love. Love, if it is true, always involves sacrifice. To love as Christ loves means to carry our own crosses: the daily burdens, the acts of self-denial, the forgiveness we offer even when it hurts, the patience we extend when we are tired, and the courage to stand for truth when it is unpopular.


The Cross teaches us that love is not always easy, but it is always worth it. It is in the giving of ourselves, sometimes in small hidden ways, sometimes in great heroic acts, that we participate in the redemptive work of Christ. This is the way to holiness. We embrace the Cross not as a punishment, but as a path to more profound union with God and greater love for others.

So today, as we exalt the Cross, let us not only venerate it with our lips but also embrace it with our lives. Let us ask for the grace to love sacrificially, to give generously, and to trust that in every cross we carry, God's love is at work, transforming suffering into salvation, and death into resurrection.

When I became your pastor, I shared that we have several priorities. One of them was the work in the Nursing Homes and Care Facilities. Our team of deacons has been working hard alongside Fr. Michael to establish a ministry that serves our brothers and sisters. We also have a great group of lay leaders who serve in those facilities. Each month, there are 23 communion services in 11 facilities in the Racine area. We care for 135 Catholics living in those facilities. This means these brothers and sisters get to receive the Body of Christ in their current situation. This brings me joy to know that in the Racine area, our Catholic family members are cared for and not forgotten. My dream is that we can continue to grow that ministry and expand that care to those who are homebound. I know many of you may have family members and loved ones who may benefit from the love and care of their family in Christ, the Church. Let us pray for all of us that we can grow in love and care for one another.






