GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

This Sunday's Gospel presents one of Jesus' most vivid and unsettling parables: the story of the rich man and Lazarus. There seems to be no mercy at all. The chasm is fixed in the afterlife because the rich man did nothing to bridge this world's chasm while he still could. Failing to build a bridge in this life puts the rich man in a deep chasm in the afterlife. This parable is found only in Luke's Gospel; it gives a name to one of the characters, Lazarus, suggesting a personal dignity that transcends his suffering. The rich man, unnamed and opulent, lives in comfort while Lazarus lies at his door, covered in sores and longing for scraps.

The contrast is stark. Lazarus is invisible to the rich man, not because he is hidden, but because the rich man has trained himself not to see. His sin is not one of commission, but omission; he fails to respond to the suffering literally at his doorstep.

Biblical scholars note that this parable is not merely about wealth, but about indifference. The rich man's deeper flaw is his belief that he has "arrived," that he can step out of the flow of life and create a world of his own. He is spiritually calcified, numbed to the pinch of holy fear and the call to repentance. His wealth has not only insulated him from Lazarus but from his own soul's hunger for virtue, growth, and communion with God and others.

The parable also critiques a false sense of security. The rich man's garments and feasts are not inherently evil, but they become problematic when they serve only himself. In contrast, Lazarus, though physically wounded, remains spiritually open; his suffering becomes a conduit for divine grace.


In the afterlife, the roles reverse. Lazarus is carried to Abraham's bosom, while the rich man finds himself in torment, begging for relief. The "great chasm" between them is no longer social or economic; it is spiritual and eternal. The rich man's plea for Lazarus to warn his brothers is denied, with Abraham declaring that even a resurrection would not convince those who refuse to listen to Moses and the prophets. This echoes a profound theological truth: conversion requires openness of heart and mind, not just evidence.

This Gospel invites us to examine our own doorsteps. Who lies there, unseen? What comforts have numbed our compassion? The rich man's tragedy is not his wealth, but his failure to use it as a means of grace. What condemned the rich man was not his riches, his clothing, and the parties he put together, but what he did not do and could have done for others with his wealth.

Let us not wait until the chasm is fixed. While there is still time, may we soften our hearts, open our eyes, and change self-preservation into self-gift. Lazarus is still at the door, and Christ is waiting in him. Who is our Lazarus today?




