




GRACE AND PEACE TO YOU, MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

We often speak about "being welcoming communities," and when asked, most people will say that their parish community is a welcoming one. Now, is it a welcoming one, or is it just an excellent place for you to talk to your friends at church? I always wonder about that. Do not get me wrong, I feel very welcome, and our communities are great and welcoming. It is just that this Sunday's readings challenge us to live a radical hospitality beyond welcoming. We are invited to reflect on the sacred and transformative power of hospitality, not merely as a social courtesy, but as a profound spiritual practice that opens the door to divine encounter.

In the first reading, Abraham welcomes three mysterious visitors under the terebinth of Mamre. His hospitality is immediate, generous, and reverent. He runs to meet the strangers, offers water, rest, and a lavish meal. Unbeknownst to him, he is entertaining the Lord Himself. This encounter becomes a moment of divine revelation: the promise of new life through the birth of a son to Sarah. Abraham's openness to the stranger becomes the setting for God's blessing. Abraham teaches us that hospitality means opening our hearts to those who are strangers.

The Gospel presents another household story, this time in the home of Martha and Mary, Jesus' friends in Bethany. Martha, like Abraham, is busy with the duties of hospitality. Mary, however, chooses to sit at Jesus' feet, listening to his word. When Martha complains, Jesus gently reminds her that Mary has chosen "the better part." This is not a dismissal of Martha's service, but a call to integrate action with contemplation. Genuine hospitality is not only about doing for others, but also about being present to them; this is a strong challenge for us. Being present requires intentionality and patience, allowing us to go with the flow of events rather than adhering to our agenda. We see that Martha is worried about food, while Mary is just enjoying the moment with the Lord. Have you experienced this in your life, missing an opportunity for a deeper connection due to your "business"?


Together, these readings challenge us to embrace a radical hospitality, one that goes beyond mere politeness or obligation. It is a hospitality that welcomes the stranger as Christ. Abraham was blessed because he welcomed three

strangers into his life. Jesus himself identifies with the strangers in Matthew 25. Radical hospitality challenges us to listen deeply and attentively, as Mary did, paying attention and being present to the other. I would say "being present" to the other is an art. We must work on this craft because this will help us not only to welcome others into our lives but also to welcome the voice of God into our hearts when we pray. Practice this week to be fully present in the moment without letting your mind wander to other things. Radical hospitality creates space for God's presence to be revealed in the ordinary rhythms of our lives. We never know when the Lord will reveal himself to us, so we need to be open.

In a world often marked by division, fear, and isolation, the Church is called to be a welcoming community. Whether through opening our homes, our hearts, or our time, we are invited to make room for others, and in doing so, we make room for God.


